# **BUDGETED ITEMS**

The monies that are fundraised are used to offset the high costs of running a successful program in the highly competitive 6A conference. The monies collected will go directly towards the following budgeted items for the upcoming 2018 season and any unexpected expenditures.

Hudl	\$1,600	This is an online service where all game film is uploaded to the web and coaches and players can review their performance. This allows for adjustments of technique, game planning and overall game play improvements.
Hudl Sideline	\$1,200	This allows for multiple angles to be videoed, captured and then instant replay on the sideline in order for near real time adjustments of missed assignments, route running, reading of defensive coverages, etc The Coaches use a large TV monitor and they have individual iPads that they use to review plays with their various groups.
End Zone Camera	\$2,700	This is the camera, extension pole and monitor that allow video to be captured for the Huddle Sideline application (detailed above) as well as game footage to be uploaded into Hudl. This provides a second advantage point for the coaching staff to
Sideline Electronics	\$3,500	This includes (2) Ipads (1) 65" TVs, an outdoor monitor stand and
Player Apparel	\$9,000	This includes all of game day apparel (compression shirt, shorts and socks), coach's apparel (shirt, pants and hats). ALL teams.
7 on 7 and Big Man Competitions	\$2,000	This is the summer 7 on 7 passing leagues and tournaments for the skill players and the Big Man competitions for our linemen.  The program uses these competitions to compete and improve their skills in preparation for the upcoming season.





# **CHAIR/COORDINATOR DESCRIPTIONS**

**Website Chair**-in charge of maintaining our club website updates important information and post game and team photos. This person needs to have computer experience.

**Social Media Chair**-in charge of the Booster Club Twitter and Facebook accounts (and any other social media we may add in the future).

Parent Coordinators- a representative for each team level, Varsity, JV & Freshmen. Will be responsible for communication between the Club and team players, parents, as well as being a member of the Banquet Committee. A very large responsibility is communicating to your team's parents any additional volunteer opportunities. For all of our team representatives, arrange team dinners, and arrange volunteer to (or they do it). During games, work with fundraising committee on getting donations for the team pre-game dinners. Develop and schedule half time activities (pop warner night) and work with Fundraising/Sponsorship Chair on activity sponsors.

Game Day Programs Chair- Duties will include selection of format for the program, procuring bids for printing, procuring advertisements, contact company that is used for team/individual pictures and obtain proofs for program, coordinating pictures and bios, spirit ads in program, distribution and sale of program and working with the Fundraising/Sponsorship Chairman. (Time requirement – planning starts in July. Publication of the Program is mid-August with distribution/sales through November).

**Fundraising/ Sponsorship Chair**- will oversee the promotion of OC Football, striving to support the teams through community and business sponsorship, promotional items and activities. Sponsorship will develop various sponsorship levels and be responsible for collecting money for sponsorships and ordering and distributing the merchandise to the sponsors. The chair will also promote the sponsorships at the parent meeting at the beginning of the season and work with the Program Chair to include the members name in the program. Work with Chairs and Board on special events sponsorship (golf tournament, banquets, etc).

**Golf Tournament Chair**- Duties will include procuring tournament site, establishing the Committee, promotion of tournament, seeking sponsors and players, organizing events for tournament, and financial reporting to the Board Officers. (Time requirement – Sponsorship planning can start anytime. Event planning starts In April/May through the Tournament which is usually held in early August.)

**Snack Bar Chair**—will oversee the football snack bar during the season, purchase merchandise for concessions, schedule volunteers for coverage for all games when concessions is open, and track inventory, expenses and profits. (Time requirement – August through the end of season or playoffs. Includes shopping during the week and being at the snack shack by 4:30 PM on home game days.)

**Banquet Chairs**- A representative from each team level (Varsity, JV & Freshmen) will be in charge of organizing their team's end of the year banquet. Work directly with the parent representatives in selecting the venue and the menu for the Banquet, held after the close of the Season. Establish and work with the Executive Board/Apparel Team Shop Chair and banquet committee on player's gifts and coaches gifts. (Time requirement – planning starts in late October through the Banquet which is usually held in November/December.)

**Team Photographer**- Take pictures of all Home and Away Football Game, post some game photos on website and social media sites, coordinate with Executive Board on player photo book orders and create photo books (Time requirement–Various throughout the year).

# HIGH SCHOOL TIMELINE

#### **GRADE 9**

#### Plan

- Start planning now! Take the right courses and earn the best grades you can.
- Ask your counselor for a list of your high school's NCAA core courses to make sure you take the right classes. Or, find your high school's list of NCAA core courses at eligibilitycenter.org/courselist.

#### **GRADE 10**

#### Register

- Register for a Certification Account or Profile Page with the NCAA Eligibility Center at eligibilitycenter.org.
- If you fall behind on courses, don't take shortcuts to catch up. Ask your counselor for help with finding approved courses or programs you can take.

#### **GRADE 11**

#### Study

- Check with your counselor to make sure you are on track to graduate on time.
- Take the ACT or SAT, and make sure we get your scores by using code 9999.
- At the end of the year, ask your counselor to upload your official transcript.

### **GRADE 12**

#### Graduate

- Take the ACT or SAT again, if necessary, and make sure we get your scores by using code 9999.
- Request your final amateurism certification after April 1.
- After you graduate, ask your counselor to upload your final official transcript with proof of graduation.

#### **Core Courses**

This simple formula will help you meet Division I and II core-course requirements.

#### 4x4=16

- + 4 English courses (one per year)
- + 4 math courses (one per year)
- + 4 science courses (one per year)
- + 4 social science courses (one per year)

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# ONE OPPORTUNITY. LIMITLESS POSSIBILITIES.

If you want to play sports at an NCAA Division I or II school, start by registering for a Certification Account with the NCAA Eligibility Center at **eligibilitycenter.org**. If you want to play Division III sports or you aren't sure where you want to compete, start by creating a Profile Page at **eligibilitycenter.org**.

#### **ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS**

To play sports at a Division I or II school, you must graduate from high school, complete 16 NCAA-approved core courses, earn a minimum GPA, and earn an ACT or SAT score that matches your core-course GPA.

#### **CORE COURSES**

Visit eligibilitycenter.org/courselist for a full list of your high school's approved core courses. Complete 16 core courses in the following areas:

#### DIVISION I

Complete 10 NCAA core courses, including seven in English, math or natural/physical science, before your seventh semester.



#### **GRADE-POINT AVERAGE**

The NCAA Eligibility Center calculates your grade-point average (GPA) based on the grades you earn in NCAA-approved core courses.

- DI requires a minimum 2.3 GPA
- DII requires a minimum 2.2 GPA

#### SLIDING SCALE

Divisions I and II use sliding scales to match test scores and GPAs to determine eligibility. The sliding scale balances your test score with your GPA. If you have a low test score, you need a higher GPA to be eligible. Find more information about sliding scales at ncaa.org/playcollegesports.

#### **TEST SCORES**

Take the ACT or SAT as many times as you want before you enroll full time in college, but remember to list the NCAA Eligibility Center (code 9999) as a score recipient whenever you register to take a test. If you take a test more than once, send us all your scores and we will choose the best scores from each test section to create your sum score. We accept official scores only from the ACT or SAT, and won't use scores shown on your high school transcript. Remember to apply the College Board concordance table for SAT tests taken in March 2016 and after.




College-bound student-athletes will need to meet the following academic requirements to practice, receive athletics scholarships, and/or compete during their first year.

#### **Full Qualifier**

- · Complete 16 core courses.
  - Ten of the 16 core courses must be completed before the seventh semester (senior year) of high school.
  - Seven of the 10 core courses must be in English, math or natural/physical science.
- Earn a core-course GPA of at least 2.300.
- Earn the ACT/SAT score matching your core-course GPA on the Division I sliding scale (see back page).
- · Graduate high school.

#### **Academic Redshirt**

- Complete 16 core courses.
- Earn a core-course GPA of at least 2.000.
- Earn the ACT/SAT score matching your core-course GPA on the Division I sliding scale (see back page).
- Graduate high school.

#### **Full Qualifier:**

College-bound student-athletes may practice, compete and receive athletics scholarships during their first year of enrollment at an NCAA Division I school.

#### **Academic Redshirt:**

College-bound student-athletes may receive athletics scholarships during their first year of enrollment and may practice during their first regular academic term, but may NOT compete during their first year of enrollment.

#### Nonqualifier:

College-bound student-athletes cannot practice, receive athletics scholarships or compete during their first year of enrollment at an NCAA Division I school.

**International Students:** Please visit **ncaa.org/international** for information and academic requirements specific to international student-athletes.

### **Test Scores**

When a student registers for the SAT or ACT, he or she can use the NCAA Eligibility Center code of **9999** so his or her scores are sent directly to the NCAA Eligibility Center from the testing agency. Test scores on transcripts will **NOT** be used in his or her academic certification.

A combined SAT score is calculated by adding reading and math subscores. An ACT sum score is calculated by adding English, math, reading and science subscores. A student may take the SAT or ACT an unlimited number of times before he or she enrolls full time in college. If a student takes either test more than once, the best subscores from each test are used for the academic certification process.

If you took the SAT in March 2016 or after, and plan to attend an NCAA Division I college or university in the 2018-19 or 2019-20 academic years, use the following charts to understand the core-course GPA you need to meet NCAA Division I requirements.
